

Goal

The goal is to get the community involved in what's happening in city government. Along the way, Engage Raytown will be used as an online tool to generate new ideas and feedback from citizens using this interactive and accessible new platform.

Feedback from the engagement website will be used by city officials in order to lay out plans on a variety of projects.

Opportunity

Engage Raytown gives contributors a chance to share new ideas, second others' ideas, expand upon existing ideas and give feedback on initiatives, working with community leaders on a variety of topics online anytime, anywhere.

EXAMPLE OF COUPON. Please note that these coupons are put on fraud free paper so that they cannot be duplicated.

Raytown offers their residents a \$5 clean-up coupon that can be purchased anytime during the year. Residents can obtain two coupons per residential property in a two-year period. All coupons have a 60-day expiration period. Proof of residency in the form of a utility bill and picture id is required to receive a coupon. The \$5 coupon has a \$25 value, the city does not set the fees that the private businesses charge. The coupon may not cover the entire fee to dispose of items; the resident is responsible for all fees that exceed the value of the coupon or coupons. No refunds are offered on the unused coupon value.



Information on Voter Registration

In order to be eligible to vote you must be registered at your CURRENT home address by the fourth Wednesday prior to the election in which you wish to vote.

The City of Raytown has four ballot issues:

1. *A renewal of the existing Capital Sales Tax*

This is a ½-cent sales tax that has in the past paid for financial software, police cars, ambulances, ambulance equipment, laptop computers for police cars, new federally compliant radios, Code and Animal Control vehicles. This tax is being requested for 10 years. The monies used by this tax are reviewed by the Sales Tax Citizens Oversight Committee made up of residents from each ward.

2. *A renewal of the existing Transportation Sales Tax*

This is a ⅜-cent sales tax that has in the past paid for snow removal equipment, snow removal supplies, street improvement supplies, sidewalk replacement, curb replacement, asphalt supplies. The monies used by this tax are also reviewed by the Sales Tax Citizen Oversight Committee and will sunset in 10 years.

3. *Shall a Commission be chosen to frame a Charter?*

Currently, Raytown is a fourth-class city with the state of Missouri. This is a question of whether to change that status to a charter or home rule city. A charter can establish the framework for how a local government operates in terms of its structure, responsibilities, functions, and processes. The way public officials are elected, the form of government, and

the role citizens play in local government are just a few examples of the important choices that can be articulated in a charter.

4. *Voting for Charter Commissioners*

You will have the opportunity to vote for 13 charter commissioners. 22 individuals are running for the 13 commissioner positions. Each of these individuals has been approved by the Jackson County Election Board as eligible for this position. Your registration does not follow you. If you move, you must make the effort to notify the election authority of your change of address.

Eligibility

- You must be 17.5 years of age to register, 18 years old to vote
- You must be a U.S. Citizen
- Resident of Jackson County excluding the city of Kansas City
- If you have prior felony conviction you must be off parole or probation
- You must not be adjudged incapacitated
- Forms of Identification (must be current)
 - » Driver's License (from any state but you must be a resident here)
 - » Birth Certificate
 - » Missouri ID
 - » Native American Tribal Document
 - » Proof of United States Citizenship



Help Keep Raytown Beautiful

The City of Raytown is committed to providing a clean and attractive community by working with residents to encourage compliance with the Raytown's Code of Ordinances.

Every citizen has a responsibility to keep his/her own property and neighborhood clean and attractive. For specific ordinance information on the code and regulations referred to in this brochure, you may contact the Community Development and Public Affairs Department at 816-737-6014.

Uncontrolled Vegetation

Lawn mowing is required. Weeds, grasses and other vegetation must be kept below 8 inches in height on all properties. Property owners are required to mow any area between their property line and the adjacent curb or street pavement line, including the ditch area.

Outside Storage

Most household items normally intended for indoor use can not be stored outside. The only items allowed outside without restrictions are yard furniture, neatly stacked firewood, garden or yard tools, outdoor toys. Temporary storage of usable building materials is allowed outside if neatly stacked at least 18 inches off the ground and not against the side of a structure. Grass clippings, leaves, brush, or similar yard waste may not be stored outside unless organized in a composting bin.

Inoperable/Unlicensed Vehicles

Inoperable and/or unlicensed vehicles are not allowed to be stored outside. However, one inoperable vehicle maybe temporarily stored outside for seven days if the work is being completed by the owner or tenant and the vehicle is titled to that individual. If the vehicle is not repaired or properly licensed in seven days, it must be either removed from the property or stored inside a garage.

Exterior Building Maintenance

All exterior building surfaces including wood, siding, doors, soffits, eaves, windows, roofs, porches and trim must be maintained structurally sound, weather tight, rodent proof and in good condition. Peeling, flaking or chipped paint should be eliminated and the surface repaired. Sidewalks, driveways and parking areas must be free of hazardous conditions. Accessory structures, fences and walls must also be maintained in good repair.

Welcome to the home of the National Champion Eastern Redbud!

The Raytown Tree Board is a volunteer organization established in 2000. Parks is proud to have a certified Municipal Specialist Arborist on staff. Currently, there are only seven in the entire state of Missouri who have earned this level of certification from the international Society of Arboriculture.

The Tree Board and our website is a resource for government and citizens of Raytown. Our latest project was installing 33 tree ID signs at Henry C. Kritser Park Walking Arboretum. www.raytowntreeboard.org.




