1) Public Comments Procedures

Teresa Henry, City Clerk, and Damon Hodges, Interim Co-City Administrator, remained available for any discussion.

Alderman Ward, seconded by Alderman Black, made a motion to recommend amending Ordinance 2996-86, Section 2-495, by substituting the word "address" with the phrase "city of residence". The motion was approved by a vote of 4-0-1-0.

Could the following be provided for members of the muni committee as they take on the conversation I started last month? Copies of the below Muni Code may be appropriate for this conversation. Thanks

Muni Committee Members,

Last month we had a discussion item regarding the issue of possibly reforming our current Liquor/Alcohol license regulations. As I mentioned in this discussion, the conversation was limited to Retail Packaged Alcohol establishments (Sec 4-110, 4-111, 4-112) NOT bars and restaurants (separate code in 4-117). Several ideas were presented from possible limitation by number or distance to requesting additional security equipment at these locations to including more commercial and residential neighbors in the application process. I'm open and curious as to what if any other ideas other aldermen may have and if there is interest to address this.

Sec. 4-110. - Malt liquor original package sales license.

A license shall be issued to all applicants who have complied with this article, licensing such applicant to sell at retail malt liquor in the original package on the licensed premises, upon payment to the city collector for each such license in an amount set forth in the city's schedule of fees and charges.

Sec. 4-111. - Wholesaler's license for sale of alcoholic beverages of all kinds.

A license shall be issued to all applicants who have complied with this article, licensing such applicant to sell alcoholic beverages of all kinds by a wholesaler to a person duly licensed to sell such alcoholic beverages at retail or wholesale, upon payment to the city collector for each such license in an amount set forth in the city's schedule of fees and charges.

Sec. 4-112. - Wholesaler's license for sale of alcoholic beverages not in excess of 22 percent of alcohol by weight.

A license shall be issued to all applicants who have complied with this article, licensing such applicant to sell alcoholic beverages not in excess of 22 percent of alcohol by weight by a wholesaler to a person duly licensed to sell such intoxicating beverages at retail or wholesale, upon payment to the city collector for each such license in an amount set forth in the city's schedule of fees and charges.
