City of Raytown to Demo Crumbling PD Annex
\$589K approved for demo, construction

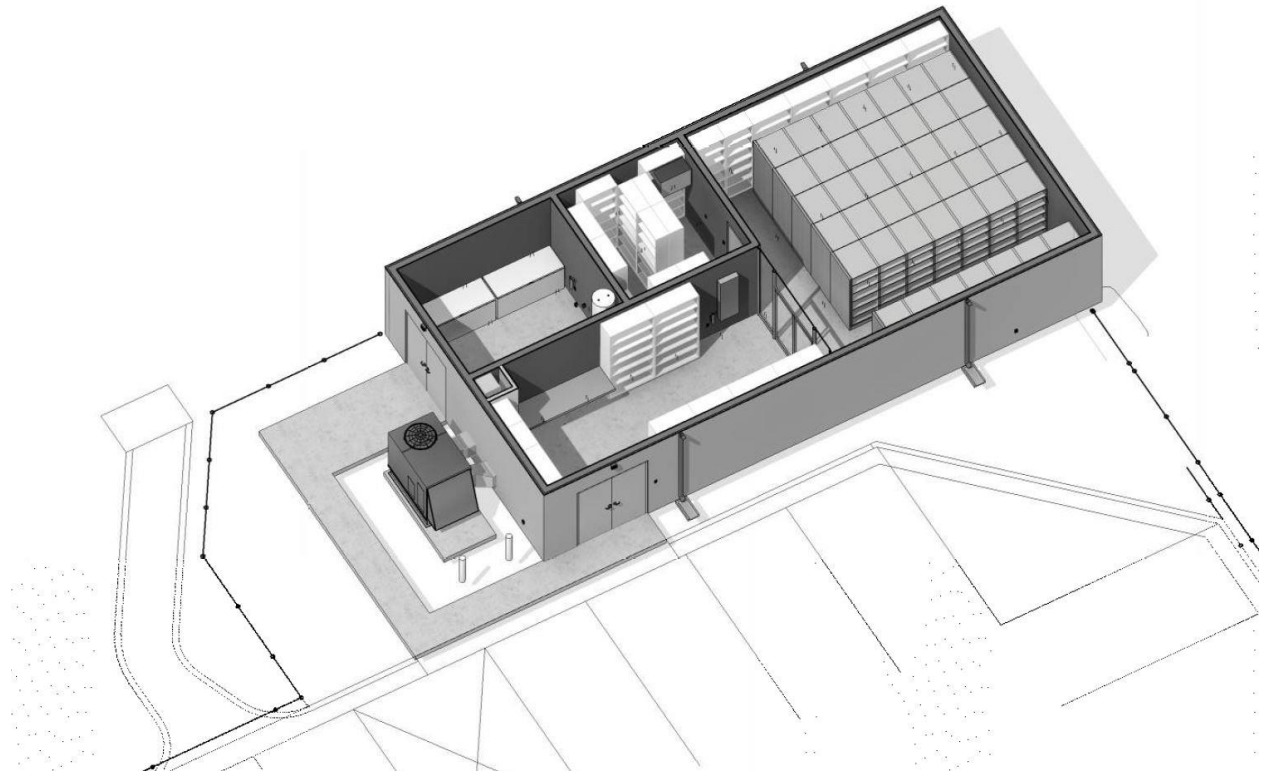
(Raytown, Mo.) – On Wednesday, Jan. 15, at 11 a.m. after a week of delays due to frigid temps and record snow, Royal Construction will demolish the crumbling PD Annex behind City Hall (10000 E 59th St). Raytown Mayor Michael McDonough, Alderwomen Loretha Hayden (Ward 2) and Theresa Garza (Ward 4) will be in attendance.

“This project is long overdue,” said Raytown Police Chief Robert Kuehl. “Today’s demolition symbolizes growth and the promise of modern facilities for our dedicated officers and civilians. We are thrilled by the progress this signifies for the City of Raytown.”

Built in the early 1990s, the current structure’s walls are deteriorating, the roof is leaking and the building is in need of a major overhaul due to deferred maintenance. Last month, the Board of Aldermen approved a resolution for construction services with Royal Construction to demo and construct a new annex for the Raytown Police Department.

The construction team of Royal Construction, George Butler Associates and SFS Architecture will transform the lot into a 1,200-square-foot state-of-the-art building. Estimated cost to demolish the current building and build a new structure cannot exceed \$549,980. Funds used are through a grant from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). The expected completion date is May 2025.
