City of Raytown Announces New Directors in Finance, Public Works and Community Development

The New Year brings new leadership to key positions at City Hall

(RAYTOWN, Mo.) – The City of Raytown has appointed Michael Graham, Robinson Camp and Diane Egger to fill director positions in its Finance, Public Works and Community Development departments. Graham, who started Jan. 23, is the latest in the string of appointments to fill the leadership vacancies.

“Since COVID, the City of Raytown has been affected by the labor shortage that has plagued municipalities and other businesses,” said City Administrator Damon Hodges. “We are pleased to welcome Michael, Rob, and Diane who all bring a wealth of experience and passion to the team. I am confident that their contributions will enhance our level of service to our residents while continuing to maintain prudent fiscal responsibility.”

Graham brings more than 30 years of experience in finance, grants, financial analysis, and payroll. His most recent position was Senior Vice President Administration/CFO with the Kansas City Area Transportation Authority. As Finance Director, Graham will oversee and manage sewer billing and collections, city revenue collections, the budget and all other activities, programs, and operations of the Finance Department.

Camp, who started Dec. 5, comes to the City from the Blanchard, Oklahoma area, where he previously worked for a national infrastructure company as well as the Cities of Chickasha and

Enid as Public Works Director. He has more than 10 years of experience managing multi-million-dollar infrastructure projects.

Egger, comes to the City from the City of Independence, bringing two decades of experience in public health and community development. Egger started on July 18, 2022, and oversees code enforcement, animal control, business licensing, the rental inspection program and all operations of the Community Development Department.

Incorporated in 1950, the City of Raytown is a Crossroads Community, Embracing Diversity, and Working Together. Raytown is located in Eastern Jackson County.
