



Mayor Michael McDonough Issues Declaration in response to COVID-19

In response to COVID-19 concerns, the City of Raytown is expanding steps to ensure the health of our community and staff.

Beginning Wednesday, March 18, all City facilities will be closed to Public access until further notice. This includes:

- Raytown City Hall
- Raytown Police Department Lobby
- Parks and Recreation Building
- Public Works and Fleet Maintenance Facility
- Rice-Tremonti Building

The Raytown Police Department encourages anyone needing to make a police report to call 816-737-6020. During the temporary closure City Hall staff is recommending citizens conduct city business by phone or via email.
